

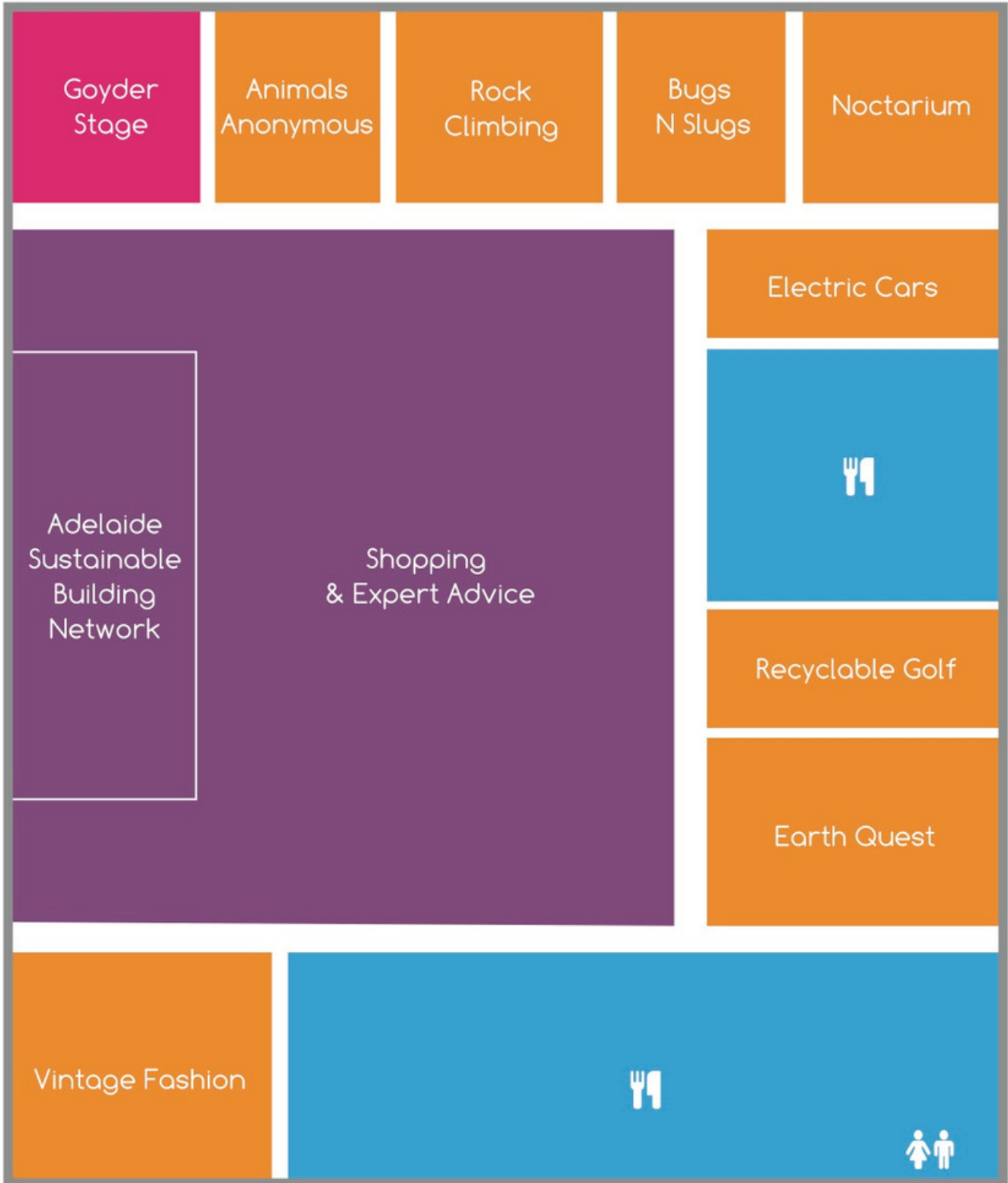
Mini Golf
